- “Green Bay gas prices have fallen 6.2 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$2.95/g today, according to GasBuddy’s daily survey of 127 stations. That’s down 16.3 cents per gallon from a month ago.”

- “Gas prices are on the decline in Wisconsin. According to Triple-A, the average price for regular unleaded is three dollars and four cents per gallon. That’s down over five cents from last week and down over ten cents from last month. The average price in Madison is \$3.01 a gallon, also down significantly from last month.”
