

WisDems: Former Trump advisor snubs radical Rebecca Kleefisch, endorses unserious candidate instead

MADISON, Wis. — Despite all Rebecca Kleefisch's best efforts to embrace an extreme right-wing platform, the first Trump ally endorsement of the GOP primary went to one of her GOP opponents. This week, Trump's former national security advisor Michael Flynn endorsed long-shot candidate Jonathan Wichmann.
