

WisDems: Gov. Evers raises pride flag over state capitol, signs executive orders

MADISON, Wis. — Yesterday, Gov. Tony Evers raised the Pride Flag over the Wisconsin State Capitol for the third time in state history, and signed three executive orders supporting the LGBTQ community. Gov. Evers authorized all state buildings to fly the Pride Flag during the month of June, directed cabinet agencies to use gender-neutral language, and prohibited the use of state and federal funds for conversion therapy.
