

WisDems: Vos earmarked \$25,000 in travel reimbursement for Gableman

MADISON, Wis. — Today, the Associated Press reported the legislature [has set aside \\$25,000 in taxpayer funds](#) to reimburse special counsel Michael Gableman for “travel” as he conducts an Arizona-style Cyber Ninja circus in Wisconsin.
