The tour, which has previously had stops in Racine, Green Bay, Milwaukee, Madison, Cambridge, La Crosse, and Eau Claire, has engaged with voters across the state about important issues affecting Wisconsinites.

- A poll released by Marquette Law School put Barnes ahead of Johnson by seven points, 51% to 44%.
