

Barnes campaign: National Security Leaders for America endorse Mandela Barnes for U.S. Senate ahead of final Jan. 6 hearing

MADISON — Today, National Security Leaders for America, a bipartisan group of former and retired senior public servants who dedicated their lives in defense of democracy, endorsed Lt. Governor Mandela Barnes, candidate for U.S. Senate, ahead of the final January 6 hearing.

“Ron Johnson attempted to overturn a free and fair election and claimed the insurrection at the Capitol was a ‘peaceful protest,’” said **Lt. Governor Mandela Barnes**. “I’m proud to have the endorsement of a group of leaders who will prioritize our democracy and that’s what I’ll fight for in the U.S. Senate.”

“We’re endorsing Mandela Barnes because we trust him to uphold democracy, ensure national security, and protect our free and fair elections,” said **John Rogers, Fmr. Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense** from Wisconsin and member of National Security Leaders for America.

“Personally, I think the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel in its front page editorial on Ron Johnson summed it up best when they said, ‘Sen. Ron Johnson’s reckless conspiracy mongering, stretching of the truth, unwillingness to accept election results and obeisance to the Trumpist right should disqualify him from public office.’ There is no doubt in my mind,” **Rogers** continued, “that Senator Johnson is a threat to Democracy and the principles for which our country stands.”

Ron Johnson's Record of Threatening Democracy

Ron Johnson has repeatedly downplayed the violence at the January 6th attack on the Capitol that injured 140 police officers, earning a "Pants on Fire" rating from [PolitiFact](#), shifted his story on his involvement in a scheme to deliver fake electors, and continued to spread conspiracy theories about the integrity of the 2020 election in an attempt to undermine faith in our democracy.

Johnson is on the record again and again downplaying the violence:
