MADISON, Wis. – Reynold's Pasty Shop in Milwaukee is issuing a Class I recall for packaged pasties sold at stores throughout Wisconsin. The recalled product includes:

- Reynold's Northern Pasty, 1-lb. packages, establishment No. 734, with the expiration date of June 23, 2022, or earlier.

This is a Class I recall, initiated based on evidence collected during a routine inspection by state inspectors. Evidence shows that the products were produced without the benefit of inspection by state officials as required by law for meat products.
