State Superintendent Dr. Jill Underly issued the following statement today regarding the 2022 general election:

And what is best for our state is strong support for public schools, and a rejection of divisive and hateful rhetoric. At the end of the day, regardless of partisan affiliation, our voters and our elected officials care about all of our children, and I will work with anyone and everyone to ensure their safety, academic success, and overall well-being.
