

Evergreen Action: NEW POLL: Wisconsin voters strongly support new federal climate law, want leaders to take action on climate change

Today, Evergreen Action and Data for Progress released [new polling](#) that shows that two-thirds of Wisconsin voters support the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA), and an even larger majority wants Gov. Tony Evers and Wisconsin leaders to aggressively pursue federal clean energy investments from the newly passed law.

The poll shows that 65% of Wisconsin voters support the IRA, including wide majorities of Democrats and Independents and 41% of Republicans. And 72% of Wisconsin voters—including majorities of Democrats, Republicans, and Independents—want Gov. Evers to pursue clean energy funding from the law.

And, looking forward to the 2022 gubernatorial election, 62% of Wisconsin voters would choose a candidate who “wants to prioritize addressing climate change,” while just 31% would pick a candidate who does not make climate a priority. Democrats pick a climate candidate by a 94% to 4% margin, while Independents prefer a climate candidate by a 63% to 25% margin.

Additional key findings:

- 61% of Wisconsin voters are concerned about climate change.
- 65% would like to see Wisconsin produce more energy from clean energy sources such as wind and solar power, while only 8% want to see Wisconsin produce less clean energy.
- 56% think Wisconsin should do more to address air pollution, following the Supreme Court's decision to limit the EPA's ability to regulate pollution from power plants that contribute to climate change.

*"Wisconsin voters strongly support the new Inflation Reduction Act and want to see their elected leaders fully utilize the key climate investments in the law," said **Data for Progress Lead Climate Strategist Danielle Deiseroth**. "This new poll shows that climate change is a top-of-mind concern for Wisconsin residents and climate action is a winning issue for gubernatorial candidates this November. Wisconsinites want to see their elected leaders take action to invest in clean energy. And, across the political spectrum, Wisconsin voters want Gov. Evers to aggressively pursue federal funding from the Inflation Reduction Act to invest in Wisconsin's future."*

*"This poll confirms that climate action is widely popular, and Wisconsin leaders would be smart to lean into clean energy policies," said **Evergreen Action Executive Director Jamal Raad**. "The Inflation Reduction Act provides a real opportunity for Wisconsin's elected leaders to invest in clean energy that will lower costs and create good-paying jobs in communities throughout the state. State leadership will be critical to fully implementing the potential of the Inflation Reduction Act. Wisconsin is poised to benefit with major investments in clean energy production."*



From July 29 to August 4, 2022, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 682 likely voters in Wisconsin using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ± 4 percentage points.
