

Evers campaign: Gov. Evers rallies voters at Democratic Convention in La Crosse

MADISON, Wis. — This past weekend, Governor Tony Evers and other Democratic leaders from across the state [joined](#) together at the Democratic Party of Wisconsin's 2022 Convention in La Crosse. This year's theme — Doing What's Right For Wisconsin — highlighted how Gov. Evers has delivered for our state over the last four years, while also looking ahead to the work that needs to be done.

At the convention, Gov. Evers and other Democratic leaders held a rally in support of abortion access following the Supreme Court's decision to overturn Roe v. Wade and roll back the rights women have had for nearly 50 years. Gov. Rebecca Kleefisch and primary frontrunner Tim Michels by name. “And we know what will happen if we aren’t successful. My opponents are already running a scorched earth campaign to divide our state. The Republican primary is a race to see who can be the loudest, the most divisive, and the most radical candidate. To put it simply, Wisconsin deserves better.”*
