GREEN BAY, Wis. — Today, Governor Tony Evers' re-election campaign is launching its next series of television ads, focused on highlighting Tim Michels' radical agenda for our state. These ads follow the Evers' campaign first ad of the general election cycle, "[Flashy](#)" — focused on Gov. Evers' experience as an educator and his record of doing the right thing for our state.

We don't have to guess what Tim Michels would do as governor, because he's already told us:
