

Godlewski Campaign: Applauds House passage of legislation to cap insulin costs, urges Senate to stand up to big pharma and take immediate action

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MADISON - Today, the U.S. House of Representatives passed the Affordable Insulin Now Act, which caps out-of-pocket insulin costs at \$35. **State Treasurer and candidate for U.S. Senate Sarah Godlewski** applauded this commonsense solution that will dramatically reduce drug costs for the [31% of Americans](#) with diabetes who rely on insulin to manage their condition and urged the U.S. Senate to quickly pass this critical legislation.

“While this is a good first step towards finally lowering the cost of prescription drugs, we have been here before, and Wisconsinites can’t afford for Congress to give up the fight again,” said **Sarah Godlewski**. “Republicans and Democrats alike in the Senate need to put people before their corporate donors and finally get this done. I have the guts to take on Big Pharma and won’t back down from this fight.”

Lowering prescription drug costs is a clear priority for Godlewski. Last month, she [released a plan](#) to reduce prescription drug prices and rein in Big Pharma, and last week in a new TV ad, she called out Washington politicians for refusing to stand up to Big Pharma and lower prescription drug prices across the board.
