- In the 2017 law, Senator Johnson championed tax relief for the approximately 95% of U.S. businesses that identify pass-through entities so they could stay competitive with large corporations.
- In 2019, 21 million filers [benefited](#) from the tax relief provisions Senator Johnson secured, up from 18 million in 2018.
