WEST ALLIS, WI - Jessica Katzenmeyer (D-West Allis) who is running for State Senate in Wisconsin's 5th District met with UW Health Nurses [who just reached a historic agreement for their voices to be heard](#) on Tuesday, September 13th.

Katzenmeyer added, “My opponent’s anti-labor record is not popular nor acceptable for our communities. He supported making Wisconsin a “right to work” state as well as Scott Walker’s Budget Repair Bill that limited the ability of public employees to collectively bargain and required them to pay more for their benefits and pensions. He even sponsored the law that did away with Wisconsin’s prevailing wage requirements. These are unacceptable stances that have hurt Wisconsin working families.”
