

Marquette University: Marquette Law School's Lubar Center to host in-person "On the Issues" program looking at the Wisconsin election, May 18

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MILWAUKEE — Prof. Charles Franklin, director of the Marquette Law School Poll; John Johnson, research fellow in the school's Lubar Center for Public Policy Research and Civic Education; and Craig Gilbert, former Washington bureau chief for the *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel* and current fellow in the Lubar Center, will discuss Wisconsin's 2022 election outlook in an upcoming "On the Issues," Wednesday, May 18, at 12:15 p.m. in the Lubar Center at Marquette University Law School's Eckstein Hall.

The conversation will be introduced by Hilary DeBlois, program manager of the Lubar Center, and moderated by Alan Borsuk, senior fellow in law and public policy at the Law School.
