

Michels campaign: From COVID to Kenosha

As Wisconsin gubernatorial candidate Tim Michels holds five grassroots rallies on the final full day of his gubernatorial campaign, he closes the night in the southeastern Wisconsin city that marked one of Governor Tony Evers biggest, and most public, failures: Kenosha.
