

Milwaukee Press Club: Milwaukee Mayor Cavalier Johnson to headline Newsmaker Luncheon

MILWAUKEE – Mayor Cavalier Johnson, will be the featured speaker at a Newsmaker Luncheon hosted by the [Milwaukee Press Club](#) on Thursday, June 2.

Johnson, the former Common Council president who became Milwaukee's acting mayor when Tom Barrett stepped down last December to become U.S. ambassador to Luxembourg, was elected April 5. He is the city's first elected Black mayor and will serve the remaining two years of Barrett's term.

Johnson will take questions from a panel of journalists and from the audience at the luncheon, to be moderated by Milwaukee Press Club President Corrinne Hess, reporter for the *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel*. The event is set for 11:45 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. at the Newsroom Pub, 137 E. Wells St.
