

Rep. Ohnstad: Responds to Kenosha investments and SCOWIS ruling

This week, Kenosha was awarded \$15 million in stimulus funds for the Kenosha Innovation Neighborhood and nearly \$10 million for Kenosha County Health and Human Services operations. Also this week, the Supreme Court of Wisconsin ruled Wisconsin will be using Governor Evers' proposed maps over the next ten years.

Representative Tod Ohnstad had the following statement:

"This has been a great week. Between the investments in Kenosha and the ruling on legislative maps, I couldn't be happier."

"Over the course of the 2021-2022 Legislative Session, Republicans have repeatedly worked to disenfranchise voters and attempt to make it harder to vote.
