

Schroeder campaign: Schroeder wins 59% of the vote in straw poll for secretary of state

The 4th Congressional District caucus favored Schroeder 59% over his opponent in the straw poll.

Spring election results bode well for our way of life in Wisconsin.

Some highlights from last night's election include:

Maria Lazar's victory marked the second time an Evers appointee was defeated in the Second District Appellate Court.

Samantha Kerkman became the first woman, and reportedly the first Republican, elected as Kenosha County Executive in a historically Democrat county. Unofficial vote totals currently point to an 807-vote win.

After Democrats spent about \$100,000 on digital advertising on three Green Bay City Council seats, conservatives won two of those three seats and a majority on the council.

Conservatives nearly doubled their seats on the 30-person La Crosse County Board, going from seven seats to 13 and nearly flipping control.

A conservative was elected County Executive in Portage County, the heavily Democrat area once known as Dane County North. Unofficial vote totals currently point to a 24-vote win.

Conservatives flipped County Boards in Calumet, Door, Kenosha, Marathon, Rock, Adams, and St. Croix Counties.
