

Sen. LeMahieu: LeMahieu re-elected Senate Majority Leader

MADISON, Wis. – Today, Senator Devin LeMahieu (R-Oostburg) was reelected by his peers as the Senate Majority Leader in the Senate Republican Caucus for the 2023-2024 legislative session. He issued the following statement:

“I am honored to be re-elected as the Senate Majority Leader for this 106th Session of the Wisconsin Legislature. We have come back stronger than before and I intend to ensure our state continues to move forward with a budget and policies that support Wisconsin’s families and businesses.

I am proud of the hard work, time, and dedication of all those that led us to a supermajority in the Wisconsin State Senate. As I reflect on everything we have accomplished for the state, this is yet another victory worth celebrating.

We have much to be proud of from our work together so far. We passed a budget which provided a historic \$3 billion tax cut that even Democrats voted for.
