At the end of the survey, respondents can indicate if they would like to participate further as a member of the District's Strategic Planning Steering Committee.

The District consists of 16 schools: 11 elementary schools, two middle schools, two high schools and the Wauwatosa Virtual Academy. Among these are two choice schools: Wauwatosa Montessori and Wauwatosa STEM, a charter school. A full STEM program is offered at Underwood Elementary and at both middle schools.
