MADISON, Wis. – Four years ago this week, Donald Trump – who bragged to have “mastered the art of the deal” – [unveiled](#) the first of a long list of notoriously [ineffective](#) infrastructure plans. Much like his entire presidency, Donald Trump's failed infrastructure deal remains a [running joke](#) that reminds voters how the Republican Party's strategy of partisanship over progress remains wholly ineffective and unpopular – and Wisconsin voters are no exception.
