“The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) and Gov. Tony Evers announced the program Tuesday, funded from Wisconsin's share of the federal pandemic relief program enacted in March, the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). The money will be used to attract and provide financial support to meat processing students in Wisconsin and to help the processing industry connect with prospective employees.”

“In collaboration with the state’s hospitals and long-term care providers, since Oct. 19, DHS has worked with staffing agencies to recruit 567 nurses, nursing assistants, and other types of health care workers to support 72 health and residential care facilities like hospitals, nursing homes and assisted living facilities across the state. This support is partially funded by resources provided to the state of Wisconsin under the American Rescue Plan Act.”

“Students looking to get into the meat processing industry are getting a leg up from Governor Tony Evers and the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection. Former Rock County Farm Bureau President and DATCP Board Member Doug Rebout says \$5 million is being made available for meat talent development assistance.”
