

WisDems: Ron Johnson's self-serving agenda is "quite clear," even if he's trying to hide it

Madison, Wis. – Today, Ron Johnson was faced with the question of what his party is for and [refused to specify](#). Unfortunately for Johnson, his actions speak louder than his words.

Here are the specifics on Johnson's self-serving agenda:
