

WisDems: Wisconsin Republicans' out of touch, anti-choice agenda

MADISON, Wis. - The far-right majority of the Supreme Court, aided and abetted by anti-abortion extremists in Congress, now appears set to overturn *Roe v. Wade* and block access to abortion across the country. This draft opinion is a result of Republican politicians in Wisconsin and across the country waging a decades-long, radical war on reproductive health care.

Despite the overwhelming majority of Americans supporting access to safe and legal abortion, Wisconsin Republicans continue to push an extreme agenda that is wildly unpopular and out of touch:
