With multiple polls (including the most recent [Marquette Law School Poll](#)) showing that crime is a top issue for voters this election, Tony Evers is trying to rewrite his history as Governor on the topic. “Governor Evers has made clear that his crowded afternoon pickleball schedule is more important to him than keeping our families safe from crime,” said Republican Party of Wisconsin Communications Director Chad Doran.
