The 2023 Acuity Health Challenge will be held Saturday, July 15, with proceeds supporting the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) at the Family Birth Center of Aurora Medical Center-Sheboygan County. The Challenge features a 2-mile or 5K run/walk, with donation and virtual race alternatives.

The Challenge marks its 11th year in 2023. The course is on Acuity’s campus at 2800 South Taylor Drive in Sheboygan, and parking will be available.
