

UW-Green Bay: Offers new Project Management Certificate program in cooperation with UW-Milwaukee

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Green Bay, Wis. – UW-Green Bay is offering a new [Project Management Certificate Program](#) in cooperation with UW-Milwaukee. Effective project managers are invaluable to companies, organizations and other enterprises to ensure a smooth process and successful outcomes.

Courses will be taught by instructors with industry and academic experience in a hybrid format that combines online study with scheduled virtual sessions. Courses are interactive and instructor-led, including recorded presentations, reading/writing assignments, quizzes and online discussion. **Courses start February 6 and run through June 17, 2023.** It is possible to earn the certificate in twenty weeks.
