

Lazar campaign: Judge Maria Lazar commits to Wisconsin's constitutionally enacted voter ID law

[Waukesha, WI] – With the “SAVE Act” facing impending failure in Washington D.C., Judge Maria Lazar, candidate for the Wisconsin Supreme Court, reaffirmed her unwavering commitment to upholding Wisconsin’s constitutionally enacted voter ID laws. While federal gridlock continues to stall common-sense election integrity measures, the stakes for the April 7th election have never been higher for the future of Wisconsin’s judicial system.

Wisconsin voters have repeatedly voiced their support for secure, transparent elections. However, the integrity of these laws is under direct threat from activist judicial philosophies that seek to bypass the will of the people and legislate from the bench.

A Commitment to the Constitution

Judge Maria Lazar issued the following statement regarding the importance of maintaining Wisconsin’s current legal standards:

“The people of Wisconsin have spoken clearly: they want an election system that is both accessible and secure. Our voter ID laws were constitutionally enacted to ensure every legal vote is counted and protected. As a judge, I took an oath to uphold the law as written, not to rewrite it to suit a political agenda. On the Supreme Court, I will respect the will of the people and be a bulwark against any attempt to jeopardize these protections, ensuring that our elections remain fair and our Constitution remains intact.”

The Contrast: Policy from the Bench

The choice in this election is between a judge who follows the law and a failed legislator who seeks to overturn it. Judge Chris Taylor has spent her entire career in the legislature attempting to dismantle voter ID requirements. Now, Taylor is seeking a seat on the state's highest court to achieve what she could not through the democratic process: enacting radical policy from the bench.

"Chris Taylor's record is clear," Nathan Conrad, Campaign Advisor stated. "She has consistently fought against the very safeguards that provide Wisconsinites with confidence in their elections. If elected on April 7th, there is no doubt she will stop at nothing to strike down these common-sense laws and impose her own legislative preferences on the entire state."
