

Wisconsin Dem Party outraises state GOP 6-1 through federal account

The state Dem Party outraised its GOP counterpart nearly 6-to-1 through their federal campaign accounts in 2025.

Their latest reports showed WisDems [raised](#) nearly \$12.8 million for the year and finished 2025 with \$806,728 in the bank along with \$38,897 in debts.

The state GOP, meanwhile, [pulled](#) in almost \$2.2 million last year through its federal account and ended 2025 with \$535,974.

WisDems' fundraising was driven by \$9.2 million in individual contributions. That includes almost \$3.3 million in unitemized donations from those giving less than \$200. Those donations are often seen as a sign of a committee's small-dollar operation.

For the year, the state GOP listed \$810,836 from individuals, including \$388,126 in unitemized donations.

The state Dem Party previously [reported](#) raising \$15.4 million in 2025 through its main state account. The parties often transfer funds between their federal account and main state fund. The party also reported pulling in \$271,130 through its segregated [account](#), which can accept donations from businesses but can't be used for electioneering.

The state GOP [reported](#) just less than \$14 million in receipts through its main state account and \$407,697 through its segregated [fund](#).
