## WCJC Recognizes Act 235 Authors for Their Leadership on Tort Reform This Session

MADISON – On May 8, 2018, Wisconsin Civil Justice Council (WCJC) recognized authors Reps. Mark Born and John Nygren and Sens. Tom Tiffany and David Craig for their leadership on Act 235, which contains a number of important civil litigation reforms. Act 235 is a significant victory for Wisconsin businesses and will reduce the cost of litigation.

Wisconsin has been recognized nationally for groundbreaking reforms included in the bill. Act 235 makes Wisconsin the first state in the country to require disclosure of third-party litigation funding.

WCJC presented the Act 235 authors with the 2018 Outstanding Leadership Award for their work on the bill in the 2017-18 legislative session.
