Wisconsin Local Employment and Unemployment Estimates Released

MADISON – The Department of Workforce Development (DWD) today released the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) estimates of unemployment and employment statistics for metro areas, major cities and counties in Wisconsin. The estimates include updates to March 2018 and preliminary estimates for April 2018. These numbers are not seasonally adjusted. In brief, the estimates show:

- Metropolitan Statistical Areas: Preliminary April 2018 unemployment rates declined in all twelve
 Wisconsin metro areas when compared over the year to April 2017. The rates ranged from 1.9 percent in
 Madison to 3.2 percent in Racine. Janesville-Beloit experienced the largest year over year decline of 0.9
 percent, followed by Racine's 0.7 percent drop. Nine (9) of Wisconsin's 12 metro areas experienced (or
 tied) their lowest April unemployment rate on record in 2018 (1990).
- Municipalities: Preliminary April 2018 rates decreased in all of the state's 32 largest cities when compared over the year to April 2017, with Beloit experiencing the largest year over year decline of 1.6 percent, followed by Milwaukee's decline of 0.9 percent since April 2017. The rates ranged from 1.7 percent in Fitchburg to 4.1 percent in Racine. Nineteen (19) of the state's 32 largest cities experienced their lowest April unemployment rate on record in 2018 (1990).
- Counties: Preliminary April 2018 rates declined or stayed the same in 63 of Wisconsin's 72 counties when compared over the year to April 2017. Florence County had the largest year over year decline of 1.1 percent since April 2017, followed by Rock County's 0.9 percent decline. The rate's ranged from 1.8 percent in Dane and Lafayette Counties to 7.9 percent in Iron County. Forty-five (45) of the state's 72 counties experienced or tied their lowest April unemployment rate on record in 2018 (1990).

The release of April 2018 local rates follows last week's release of BLS monthly estimates showing that Wisconsin's statewide seasonally adjusted unemployment rate declined to a new all-time low of 2.8 percent in April 2018, which ranks 5th lowest nationally. The data also showed that Wisconsin ranked 2nd in the nation and 1st in the Midwest for adding 13,700 manufacturing jobs from April 2017 to April 2018. Wisconsin's labor force participation rate also increased by 0.2 percent to 68.9 percent. The 0.2 percent rank increase in Wisconsin labor force participation rate over the month tied for 2nd nationally. Other highlights of the statewide release include:

- Wisconsin ranked 3rd nationally in the number of manufacturing jobs added in 2018.
- Wisconsin's labor force participation rate of 68.9 percent in April ranked 5th nationally.
- Wisconsin's record-low unemployment rate of 2.8 percent in April ranks 5th nationally and tied for 1st in the Midwest.

Other indicators of the state of Wisconsin's economy include:

• Initial UI claims ended 2017 at their lowest level in the last 30 years.

- Continuing unemployment claims ended 2017 at their lowest level since 1973.
- Moody's investor Service recently upgraded the state's credit rating, nothing that "(T)he stable outlook reflects the expectation that the state will experience moderate economic growth and will continue its prudent fiscal management practices."
