## SORRY, YOUR "PANTS ON FIRE!"

(MADISON)—Today, Senator Tim Carpenter made the following statement:

"Last Thursday, an Assembly Republican Committee Chair made a statement explaining that, 'The public has every right to know if there are secret negotiations taking place that could undermine the legislature-approved contract with Foxconn.'
