WISCONSIN WATER ALLIANCE WELCOMES NEW BOARD MEMBERS

Lee Nerison is a retired farmer and former member of the Wisconsin State Assembly. During his time in the Legislature, Lee was a leader on issues impacting agriculture and the environment – chairing the Assembly Committee on Agriculture and serving on the Committee on Natural Resources. He resides in Westby in Vernon County.

T.J. Tuls is a fourth generation dairy farmer. He grew up learning the industry on his family's dairy farm in Nebraska; today, he manages Rock Prairie Dairy near Janesville and Pinnacle Dairy in Brodhead, and he serves as chief operations officer of the family company, Tuls Dairies.
