Coalition endorses transit improvements, vehicle registration fee

City budget proposal would help speed transition to all-electric transportation system

MADISON - A coalition of environmental and public interest groups endorsed a proposal before the City's Common Council to expand bus service, prepare the city for bus rapid transit, and make possible other components of the City's <u>Metro Forward</u> plan. The proposal creates a \$40 municipal vehicle registration fee to fund these improvements that will reduce traffic congestion and transition Madison Metro's fleet to all-electric buses in the coming years. The Council will vote on the proposal in a special session later today.

WISPIRG, RENEW Wisconsin, 1000 Friends of Wisconsin, Clean Wisconsin and Wisconsin Environment sent a <u>letter</u> to the Common Council and released the following statements in support of the proposal:
