Bill Introduced to Commemorate 50th Anniversary of Earth Day

MADISON – Representative Dianne Hesselbein (D-Middleton) circulated new legislation today commemorating the 50th Anniversary of Earth Day and its founder, former Wisconsin Governor and U.S. Senator Gaylord Nelson. When LRB-3937 is passed into law, the daily fee for admission to a state park on April 22nd of each year will be waived. Representative Hesselbein released the following statement:

On Earth Day, everyone should have equal access to Wisconsin's beautiful state parks. Former Wisconsin Governor and U.S. Senator Gaylord Nelson wanted us to enjoy our natural resources while preserving our environment for future generations. Let's ensure all Wisconsinites who wish to spend their Earth Day at one of our state parks can do so.
