- I will work to support the growth of local businesses and ensure workers have a fair shake by protecting and improving the right to organize.
- I will work to ensure every Wisconsinite gets the federal health care dollars they need and to seek to reduce the cost of healthcare. Cost should never be a barrier to quality care.
- I will work to protect our elderly and vulnerable citizens and those who serve them.
- I will work to protect our environment especially our waterways, and to work toward a more sustainable future.
