*The Wisconsin Dental Association today released the following statement from WDA President **Dr. Paula Crum** (Green Bay), after Gov. Tony Evers signed legislation to allow dentists to administer certain vaccines:*

"On behalf of the 3,100 members of the Wisconsin Dental Association, I would like to thank Gov. Evers for signing Senate Bill 13 into law. Through his action, Wisconsin's 3,500 licensed dentists are now authorized to administer COVID and influenza vaccines following eight hours of training and education. This legislation received unanimous, bipartisan support in both houses of the state legislature.
