Wisconsin Elections Commission Receives Award Furthers Access for Voters with Disabilities

Congratulations to the Wisconsin Elections Commission (WEC) for receiving a U.S. Election Assistance Commission (EAC) 2020 Clearinghouse Award for their work to improve accessibility for voters with disabilities.

The "Clearies" are awarded in five categories including initiatives that help further voting access for people with disabilities while upholding the provisions in the Help America Vote Act (HAVA) and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). The WEC was recognized for their work to improve accessibility, including establishment of an Accessibility Advisory Committee to address accessibility concerns and inclusion.
