Representative Krug responds to Governor Taking Credit for Republican Tax Cuts and Signing Republican Budget

Madison...State Representative Scott Krug (R-Rome) released the following statement about the Wisconsin 2021-2023 State Budget that Governor Evers signed into law.

“Earlier today, Governor Evers signed into law a Wisconsin State Budget that my colleagues in the State Assembly and I worked to craft; delivering a tax cut for working Wisconsin families that we have not seen in a generation. While Governor Evers’ proposed budget plan would have raised our taxes by more than \$1 billion, my colleagues and I have worked for the past several months to build a spending plan that returns \$3.4 billion to taxpayers.”

“The Joint Finance Members based their revisions of the governor’s budget on common sense and responsible spending. I’m glad that the governor took the same common sense approach today when he signed the revised budget that my colleagues and I sent back to him.”

“This historic tax-cutting, fiscally responsible budget crafted by the Republican legislature deserved to be signed into law, but without the political, partial vetoes. It is clear the legislature listens to the people of Wisconsin and can create a budget that’s good for all of Wisconsin.”

“During his address, Governor Evers recognized that he has the opportunity to utilize funding from the federal government without legislative approval for major priorities. He should invest in our communities and allocate a portion of these funds to Wisconsin Rapids and Park Falls communities today. I call on Governor Evers to sign Assembly Bill 367, and if he absolutely feels if he needs to veto the bill I call on him to assist with the purchase and reactivation of the paper mills in Wisconsin Rapids and Park Falls. ”
