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Governor Evers' Investment in Apprenticeships and Workforce Programs Will Result in Long-term Solutions for Tech Employers

MILWAUKEE, WI-

Proposed workforce programs announced by Governor Evers on Wednesday will fund initiatives, such as registered apprenticeships and worker retraining, to help develop skills needed by businesses to secure enduring economic prosperity and create upward mobility for workers to better, higher quality and more family sustaining jobs.

"The Milwaukee Tech Hub Coalition have determined through our current registered tech apprenticeship program that collaboration between industry, non-profits, workforce development boards, and state/local government leads directly to more tech-ready workers that employers are desperate for these days. Our data indicates that investment in reskilling initiatives, such as registered tech apprenticeships, increases both capacity and diversity," commented Kathy Henrich, CEO of The Milwaukee Tech Hub Coalition. "We applaud Gov. Tony Evers' investment of \$130 million toward workforce development programs," said Henrich.

Targeted talent development is a powerful engine for the economic recovery. Skill gaps in tech, including areas like software development, data, analytics, cloud, security, and engineering, will constrain the economic recovery of the region.

The funds, which come from the state's American Rescue Plan Act allocation, will be spread across three programs that will help regions find solutions to workforce challenges and help unemployed or underemployed workers find job opportunities. The largest block of funding will provide grants to at least 10 local and regional entities with about \$10 million each to help meet needs including apprenticeships, training, pilot programs and transportation. Evers said that funding would go out sometime in the fall to give regions time to develop proposals.
