Re: Mandela Barnes Posts Record-Setting First Fundraising Quarter

Lt. Governor Mandela Barnes announced today that he raised over \$1.12 Million in Q3 2021 in his race for US Senate. Not only is this the best quarter posted by any Democrat in the race, but it also represents the largest first quarter raise by a first-time US Senate candidate in Wisconsin's history.

Even more impressively, Lt. Governor Barnes raised this total in only 10 weeks and did it with an average contribution of under \$50. He received 19,000 donations from over 15,000 donors, with donations from every single one of Wisconsin's 72 counties. This perfectly underscores the statewide coalition of grassroots supporters who are coming together to beat Ron Johnson and elect Mandela Barnes to the Unites States Senate.

Living up to his promise, Mandela took no money from corporate PACs.




This report caps off 3 months that saw Lt. Governor Barnes emerge as the clear favorite to take on Ron Johnson and flip the seat for Democrats.

### Mandela Leads the Field by a Wide Margin, is Tied with Ron Johnson

Two polls released in September clearly demonstrate that Mandela is the early favorite to flip this seat. In a matchup between Democratic primary challengers, Mandela emerges with 37% of the vote, with every other Democrat in the race below 8%. Mandela is winning every media market and holds a double-digit lead even among those who have favorable views of his primary opponents.

In a general election matchup, Mandela is tied with Ron Johnson 43/43, and Mandela is the only candidate tested who received net-positive favorability ratings from voters. Critically, after voters learned about Mandela's story and record, he jumped into a 50/45 lead over Ron Johnson.

## **Leaders Across Wisconsin are Supporting Mandela**
