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Bi-Partisan Majority Agree SB490/AB527 is Not a Good Bill

MADISON – Senate Bill 490/Assembly Bill 527 will impose higher electricity costs for most utility customers by having them subsidize "community solar gardens" throughout Wisconsin.

Under the proposed legislation, solar developers would be given the ability to develop solar facilities up to 5 MW in size at no risk — the costs will shift to and be paid for by all "non-subscribing" customers.

The bill, introduced in September, is opposed by organizations including customer groups, co-operatives, local and public energy providers, investor-owned utilities and the state chamber of commerce.

"People understand this is a cost-shift for everyone who doesn't buy a subscription," said Bill Skewes, Executive Director of the Wisconsin Utilities Association. "When 132 legislators have a chance to get on board but only 5 do, the lack of traction for this idea is obvious".

Similar legislation in Minnesota, on which SB 490/AB 527 is modeled, shifted costs to non-participating customers who received no benefit from the program.

According to the Wisconsin Ethics Commission, over 70% of <u>the registrations</u> on the bill are in opposition and the <u>co-sponsor list</u> continues to shrink with only 5 legislators signing on to the bill.
