The conference features wetland experts from Wisconsin and beyond, including plenary presenters:

- **Peter David**, Wildlife Biologist, Great Lakes Indian Fish & Wildlife Commission, *Lessons learned in the Great Spirit's garden* (about wild rice)
- Jennifer Smith, State Soil Scientist, USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service, *Why* soils matter to wetlands: Lessons from a lover of hydric soils

A special Wetland Soils and Carboy Symposium will bring national speakers to speak on the role of wetlands and wetland soils in storing and sequestering vast amounts of carbon.

- Learn about wetland topics from plant identification to wetland management, and hydrologic assessment to climate change.

- Engage in interactive discussions and networking with speakers and other attendees
