**STATE'S LARGEST LAW ENFORCEMENT GROUPS ISSUES  
ITS 2022 LEGISLATIVE REPORT CARD**

*Legislators of the Year & Law Enforcement Honor Roll Are Also Named*

(MADISON, Wis.) – The WPPA released today its biennial report card ranking Wisconsin's lawmakers for their support during the 2021-22 legislative session. The rankings are the product of a cumulative scoring methodology that awards and deducts points to lawmakers for their actions at every stage of the legislative process on each bill for which the WPPA registered its support or opposition with the State Ethics Commission. The approach recognizes lawmakers for the bills and amendments they introduce, their committee votes, and their votes on the floors of their respective chambers.

"Since 2006, the WPPA Legislative Report Card has served as an objective and non-partisan assessment of how much our elected leaders support the issues that matter to Wisconsin's law enforcement officers," said WPPA Executive Director Jim Palmer. "It provides the dedicated men and women that police our streets with a valuable resource that they can use to inform themselves when deciding how they will vote in the fall elections."

In addition to ranking legislators in both the State Assembly and Senate, the WPPA also announced which lawmakers had been named to its "Law Enforcement Honor Roll," and that it has awarded the "WPPA 2022 Legislators of the Year" distinction to State Senators **Van Wanggaard** and **André Jacque**, as well as State Representatives **David Steffen** and **John Spiros**.

"As our report card demonstrates, the WPPA's Legislators of the Year have been superb champions for both public safety and the officers that serve to provide it," said Palmer. "They and the other lawmakers recognized on our Law Enforcement Honor Roll have proven their support of the officers that serve to keep Wisconsin a safe place in which to live, work, and raise a family."

With more than 10,000 members from over 300 local association affiliates, the WPPA is the state's largest law enforcement group.
