Lutheran Social Services to Present Inaugural Caregiver Hero Award to The Lutheran Home in Honor of Former WI Governor Martin J. Schreiber

MILWAUKEE (October 27, 2022) – On November 3, 2022, <u>Lutheran Social Services of Wisconsin & Upper</u> <u>Michigan</u> (LSS) will inaugurate its first LSS Caregiver Hero Award during a special 140th anniversary event in downtown Milwaukee. Martin J. Schreiber (Marty), former Wisconsin Governor, previously received a Lifetime Caregiver Hero Award from LSS in 2019, and the annual award will be presented in his honor to all future winners.

<u>The Lutheran Home</u> will receive the 2022 LSS Caregiver Hero Award, in honor of Marty Schreiber, for its dedication to serving older adults and enriching the lives of others through compassion, commitment, collaboration, and loving care. Among its many offerings, The Lutheran Home provides adult day services, skilled nursing, rehabilitation, intergenerational programs. In 2021, the organization opened Elaine's Hope, a specialized memory care assisted living named after Elaine Schreiber, Marty's wife of 60+ years, who died from Alzheimer's disease earlier this year.

"The people that work at The Lutheran home are Servant-Leaders. Their compassion extends beyond the residents to the family members and friends that are closest to them," said LSS President and CEO Héctor Colón. "They embody *caring for the caregiver* – a critical part of residential support that Marty Schreiber himself experienced and expresses in his book, *My Two Elaines: Learning, Coping and Surviving as an Alzheimer's Caregiver*. We are thrilled to share this wonderful award during National Family Caregivers Month."

Along with The Lutheran Home and Elaine's Hope, Marty has been a passionate Alzheimer's advocate throughout his career for raising awareness, supporting research, and sharing ways to help caregivers cope and thrive.

The special 140th anniversary celebration with award presentation begins at 5:30 p.m. on November 3 at No Studios Rooftop and Skyline Bar (1037 W. McKinley Ave, Milwaukee).
