AJR76	August / Bradley Relating to: eligibility to vote in Wisconsin (second consideration).
AJR77	August / Wimberger Relating to: prohibiting state and local governments from using privately sourced moneys or equipment in connection with the conduct of elections and specifying who may perform tasks related to the conduct of an election (second consideration).
AJR78	Snyder / Wanggaard Relating to: requiring photographic identification to vote in any election (first consideration).
AJR88	Plumer / Tomczyk Relating to: declaring the brandy old-fashioned as Wisconsin's state cocktail.
AB38	Steffen / Cabral-Guevara Relating to: absentee ballot request and return confirmation.
AB93	Knodl / Stroebel Relating to: verifying citizenship of individuals on the official voter registration list and contents of operator's licenses and identification cards.
AB282	Sortwell / Wimberger Relating to: broadcasting election night proceedings. <i>Committee on Campaigns and Elections 8-1.</i>
AB298	Sortwell / Taylor Relating to: polling place closures. <i>Committee on Campaigns and Elections 7-2.</i>
AB330	Ortiz-Velez / James Relating to: the number of signatures on nomination papers.
AB335	Ortiz-Velez / Knodl Relating to: judgments concerning a candidate's felony violation of certain campaign finance or election fraud laws.

AB396	Binsfeld / Knodl Relating to: fees for obtaining the official voter registration list.
AB441	Bodden / Stroebel Relating to: timeline for sending or transmitting presidential preference primary absentee ballots.
AB476	Magnafici / Tomczyk Relating to: filling vacancies in elective state offices in the executive branch.
AB493	Macco / Wanggaard Relating to: counting write-in votes in the general election.
AB494	Duchow / Knodl Relating to: status as an indefinitely confined voter for purposes of automatically receiving absentee ballots and providing a penalty.
AB543	Tittl / Quinn Relating to: election observers and providing a penalty.
AB552	Rettinger / Tomczyk Relating to: setting a maximum age for serving as a supreme court justice or judge of a court of record.
AB567	Tusler / Cabral-Guevara Relating to: transmitting and canvassing absentee ballots, use of central counting locations, election night reporting, whistleblower protection for municipal clerks, notifications and verifications concerning citizenship status, court determinations of incompetency and ineligibility to vote, and providing a penalty.
AB570	Maxey / Jacque Relating to: certain kinds of election fraud, defects on absentee ballot certificates, returning absentee ballots to the office of the municipal clerk, appointment of election officials, allowing an employee of a residential care facility or qualified retirement home to serve as a personal care voting assistant during a public health emergency or an incident of infectious disease, and providing a penalty.
AB571	Dittrich Relating to: maintenance of the voter registration list, training of municipal clerks, data sharing agreements, pre-election procedures, lines at the polls on election day, and granting rule-making authority.
AB572	Kitchens / Quinn Relating to: absentee voting in certain residential care facilities and retirement homes and court determinations of incompetency and ineligibility to vote.

Relating to: an election official's personal information; battery against election officials; whistleblower protection for municipal clerks, county clerks, and election officials who witness and report election fraud or irregularities; harassing election officials; and providing a penalty.
