The average price received by farmers for corn during October 2023 in Wisconsin was \$4.80 per bushel according to the latest USDA, National Agricultural Statistics Service – Agricultural Prices report. This was 27 cents below the September price and \$1.19 below October 2022.

The October 2023 average price received by farmers for soybeans, at \$12.40 per bushel, was \$1.30 below the September price and 80 cents below the October 2022 price.

The October average oat price per bushel, at \$3.97, was 15 cents above September but 50 cents below October 2022.

All hay prices in Wisconsin averaged \$168.00 per ton in October. This was \$10.00 above the September price and \$13.00 above the October 2022 price. The October 2023 alfalfa hay price, at \$183.00, was \$9.00 above the previous month and \$14.00 above October 2022. The average price received for other hay during October was \$133.00 per ton. This was \$20.00 above the September price and \$28.00 above October last year.

The average price for milk was \$19.40 per cwt, 40 cents below the September price and \$5.20 below October 2022.

The Wisconsin all milk price for October 2023 was \$19.40 per hundredweight (cwt) according to the latest USDA, National Agricultural Statistics Service - Agricultural Prices report. This was 40 cents below last month's price and \$5.20 below last October's price. The U.S. all milk price for October was \$21.60 per cwt, \$2.20 higher than Wisconsin's price and 60 cents higher than last month's U.S. price.
