For 20 years, Judge Schoenborn was a federal prosecutor in the United States Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of Wisconsin. As a federal prosecutor, she worked every day to try and keep the communities of southeast Wisconsin safe. Her work included:

- Assigned to complex narcotics cases
- Multi-defendant drug conspiracies and wiretap prosecutions
- Drug prosecutions focused on the investigation, conviction and sentencing of drug traffickers related to dangerous cartels
- Prosecuted multi defendant gang cases
- Money laundering, including the use of businesses as fronts
- Seizure of ill gotten gains including restaurant franchises and cash seizures
- Most recently, she was assigned to money laundering through cryptocurrency working to
  protect the more vulnerable citizens who have been scammed out of their hard earned
  money through telephone, email and social media based fraud
