The 94th district also includes the City of Onalaska, Villages of Holmen and West Salem, and the Towns of Farmington, Hamilton, Holland, Onalaska, and Medary along with portions of the northside in the City of La Crosse. Early voting is currently underway in Wisconsin. Absentee ballots must be returned by 8:00 PM on Election Day which will be held on Tuesday, November 5.
